

Behavioral Health Provider Directed Payment Increase

Effective January 1, 2023, the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) implemented four behavioral health-directed payments (BHDP's) within the CCO contracts that will further the goals and priorities of the Medicaid program.

1. Tiered Uniform Rate Increase Directed Payment based on % of Medicaid revenue received.

Rate increase will be in addition to the rates in place for CCOs for qualified BH providers providing ACT/SE, MH Services Non-Inpatient and Substance Abuse effective January 1, 2022.

Tier 1 = 15% of negotiated rate effective Jan 1, 2022, for providers with less than 50% of BH service revenue derived from providing Medicaid services in the prior CY

Tier 2 = 30% of negotiated rate effective Jan 1, 2022, for providers with greater than 50% of BH service revenue derived from providing Medicaid services in the prior CY

2. Co-Occurring Disorder Directed Payment - requiring certification by the state.

Rate increases will be structured as follows for those providing A&D Residential, MH services Non-inpatient, MH Children's Wraparound and/or Substance Abuse.

10% of the FFS State Plan Fee schedule for providers treating members with COD

20% of the FFS state plan fee schedule for providers with a Master's degree in BH field treating members with COD
15% for FFS State Plan fee schedule for Residential providers treating members with COD.

3. CLSS Directed Payment - requiring certification by the state.

Rate increases will be structured as follows for those providing ACT/SE, Applied Behavior Analysis, MH Services Non-Inpatient, MH Children's Wraparound and/or Substance Abuse.

22% of the FFS State Plan Fee schedule for Non-Rural qualifying providers

27% of the FFS State Plan Fee schedule for Rural qualifying providers

4. Minimum Fee Schedule Directed Payment

The directed payment will require BH providers in A&D Residential, Applied Behavior Analysis, MH Children's Wraparound to be paid at least the FFS State Plan fee schedule rate for services delivered during the contract year.
